

How to reach Dibrugarh University :

The Dibrugarh University is located in the district headquarter, Dibrugarh. Dibrugarh is well connected with all the major cities of India by Air, Road and Railway. Regular day and night bus service is available from Guwahati to Dibrugarh. Weather is cold in Dibrugarh during February. Warm woollen clothes will be necessary.

About Dibrugarh University :

Dibrugarh University, the easternmost University of India, was set up in 1965 under the provisions of the Dibrugarh University Act, 1965, enacted by the Assam Legislative Assembly. It is a teaching-cum-affiliating University with limited residential facilities. The University is situated at Rajabheta, at a distance of about 5 (five) kilometres to the south of the premier town of Dibrugarh in the eastern part of Assam as well as India.

About the Host Department :

The Department of Education is one of the oldest Departments of Dibrugarh University, which started functioning from 20th September 1965. It started with a teacher-training course called Bachelor of Teaching (B.T). Till 1968 the Department was known as the 'Institute of Education' and from 1968 it came to be known as the Department of Education with the same B.T. course. In 1969, the Department was shifted to its permanent Rajabheta Campus. The Department was raised to the status of 'College of Teacher Education' (CTE) from 1st September, 1989. The Department introduced the M. Ed. Course from 1st September 1989 and four years later the liberal academic course of M.A. in Education was also initiated from the session 1992-93. Presently the Department is offering 5 (five) programmes, viz. two-year B. Ed Programme, two-year M. Ed programme, MA programme in Education, M. Phil Programme in Education and Ph. D. Programme in Education. The Department is making significant contributing to the pedagogic improvement in the education scenario of the region.

Theme of the Seminar :

A paradigm shift is a radical change in the core concepts and practices of a given domain, discipline or field. In the 21st century, education system has become the most powerful tool to build a knowledge-based society and for this the shifting paradigm for education has become most popular and essential topic of discussion and debate among the scholars and academicians. Paradigm shift in education has played a vital role, as digitization has moved everyone from scarcity of information to an abundance of information. Globalisation and internationalization of education has resulted in new access and delivery models that has increased choice and mobility of students. Virtual learning has changed the method of educating the students.
